As the roll-out of the vaccine starts to bring some semblance of normality back, we hope that 2021 will allow people to start getting their lives back to normal.

Throughout the past months, your local councillors have been working hard, both in keeping the Council running the services that are essential to everyone, but also helping residents either in their capacity as Councillors helping to resolve residents issues or through working with local charities providing support for residents who needed it. This has included helping to distribute food to those in need, assisting with the bereaved and raising money for former armed forces personnel.

April last year saw the transformation of the local councils into a single unitary council. Buckinghamshire Council is now responsible for all the services previously carried out by Wycombe District Council and Bucks County Council. The elections which were to be held last May were delayed by a year because of the pandemic and will now be held this May. In the meanwhile, all the councillors from the former councils have automatically become members of the new Council. All three of your local councillors have senior roles in the administration. Cllr Tony Green is the Cabinet Member for Youth Provision, Cllr Arif Hussain is Chairman of the High Wycombe Community Board and Cllr Sarfaraz Raja is Chairman of the High Wycombe Town Committee. All three of them will be standing for re-election to the Council in May as your Conservative candidates.

# TERRIERS FARM

Local Conservatives will oppose unsuitable development on Terriers Farm.

Although no planning application has been submitted yet for Terriers Farm, there is a concern that the land's owners will ignore the planning brief that was produced by the WDC planning officers in consultation with local residents. We will keep a close eye on any proposed plans and will strongly oppose any that result in the site being overdeveloped or being developed in an unsustainable way. We also expect existing residents in the area not to be disadvantaged by the additional homes. The plan below shows the plan the developers put forward in 2005 that was refused both by the Council and by the Planning Inspector.



# ROAD IMPROVEMENTS

The following roads are programmed to have resurfacing works carried out on them in the next three years.

The table below shows which roads will be resurfaced. The Council has spent £220M over the past nine years improving the roads and the Conservatives are committed to spending a further £120M on improving the roads over the next four years.
